

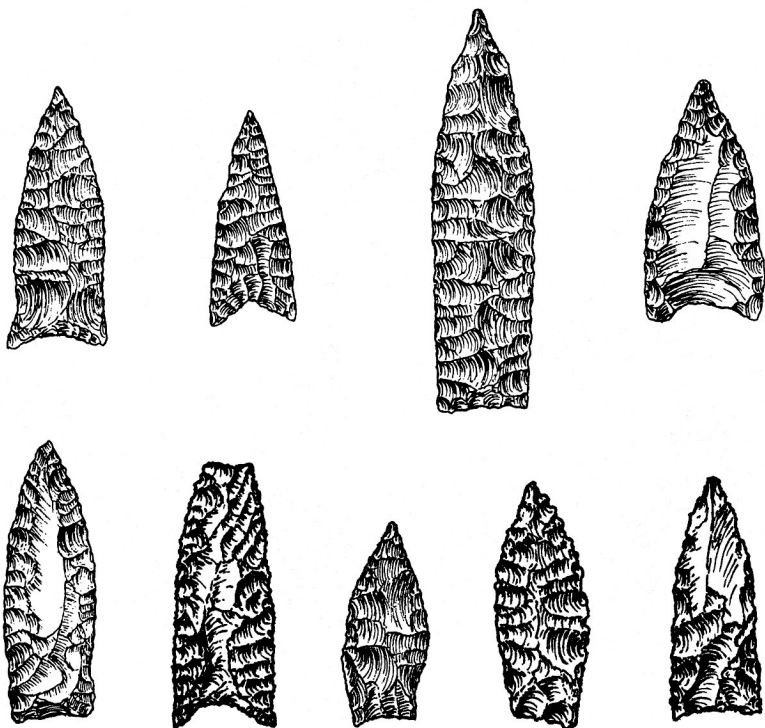
Stone Artifacts of Texas Indians

GUERRERO

A triangular to lanceolate point made during the Spanish Colonial era (1700s) of Coahuila and Texas, often referred to as "mission" points. They sometimes have very careful parallel-flaking. They are primarily found in mission Indian middens, but they also occur at ranchos and at historic Indian occupation sites. Some specimens are knapped from shards of glass.



Distribution: South and southeast Texas and into Coahuila, México. **Period:** Historic (18th century). **Sites:** San José Mission; San Juan Capistrano Mission; Concepción Mission; Shanklin (41WH8)
